A Few Words from the Superintendent

This past week the staff was trained again, as we do annually, on what to do in case of an active shooter in the building. For years we have not believed that in a small school like Grand Ridge we would ever be in danger of such an event; but every year there are more and more violent acts committed in schools. Just this week there were 2 school shootings, one in Texas and the other in Kentucky. Last year, closer to home, there was an event that did not result in a shooting outside of Leland. This week there was an event that did not result in a shooting at Streator HS. The times have changed and unfortunately we must change with them.

As security has gotten stricter here at the school we have heard many comments about how it is not the same. Parents used to walk in without having to be buzzed at the door. Coaches could come and go after hours without any concerns. Faculty didn't have to wear name badges. Classroom doors were usually open and unlocked. Those days are gone due to the heightened level of violent behavior in our state and our society. Each week we receive information from different sources about the need for certain safety precautions or individuals we must keep an eye on. We take these warnings seriously and make sure to have procedures in place to deal with the issues. The issues are not only student related, but far too often, adult related.

Last year we had an event unfold where a couple was having a domestic dispute at the gas station which then led to a high speed run through our parking lot during school hours with the man hanging on the hood of the car. We had to put the building on soft lock-down and administration and staff were dispatched to the car and notified the police who took control of the situation. Every day we are monitoring people who are on different lists that may or may not have custodial rights for their children that attend our school, and it is our duty to make sure that those laws are enforced.

Mr. Ahearn and I take the security of the building and your children's safety as our top priority. There is a lot of pressure to make sure that nothing happens to children while they are at our school each day, and we understand and respond to that pressure. We will continue to do so. Understand that our efforts to secure and protect are necessary. If we did not have to implement such measures, we would not employ them. Here are some statistics for you to understand the nature of what we deal with in education each day:

- * Between 2013-15 Everytown identified 160 school shootings across 38 states. Nearly 53 percent of the identified shootings took place at K-12 schools, and 47 percent took place on college or university campuses.
- * In 95 incidents over half the perpetrator(s) intentionally injured or killed at least one other person with a gun.
- * Between 2013 and 2015, an average of two school shootings took place at K-12 schools each month. Among shootings at K-12 schools in which the age of the shooter was known, 56 percent (39 of 70) were perpetrated by minors. This is consistent with an analysis of school-associated violent deaths between 1992-99 by the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, which found that 56 percent of students involved directly in a school-associated homicide or suicide used a firearm, and of those guns for which the source could be determined, 79 percent were obtained from the shooter's home or that of a friend or relative.—Everytown Research.org

It is not our goal to frighten parents or students; but it is our responsibility to inform you that we must take extra precautions to protect and serve your students here at our school. We cannot gamble with our most precious resource, and Mr. Ahearn and I plan to do all we can to protect our staff and your children.



All registration fees <u>must</u> be paid in full by February 1st or they will be turned over to our collection agency.






SCIENCE FAIR Thursday, February 9th

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
